- 1.) Project One: Draw a map of Colonial Boston. Use the Paul Revere's Ride by Longfellow to trace Revere's route through Boston towards Lexington and Concord. Label the route by using clues from the poem. You can also use our Social Studies book for help. Page 251. Add landscape features like rivers, bridges and buildings. Add a timeline of his ride using the poem. Add a map key.
- 2.) Project Two: Look closely at the battles of Lexington and Concord. Pick one of these two fights and create a battle map. Correctly label the towns and the opposing forces. Add landscape features like rivers, bridges and buildings. Add timeline for these battles. Add a map key.

Be creative!!!! Use books, internet, atlases or any other resource you can think of in order to create your map. You can draw a map, or make a 3-D type map. Make sure the maps have a key, are neat, correctly labeled, and colorful.
